

2014 Disclosure Calendar

Constitutional Office Candidates and Appellate Court Judicial Candidates

Please Note: This calendar does not apply to legislative candidates, district court judicial candidates, political committees and funds, ballot question committees and funds, independent expenditure committees and funds, or political party units.

January 31	2013 Year-end Report of Receipts and Expenditures due. Period covered: 1/1 through 12/31/2013.
February 3	\$25 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the year-end Report of Receipts and Expenditures due January 31.
February 25 through end of regular session	Legislative session. Constitutional office candidates may not accept contributions from political committees, political funds, lobbyists, or unregistered associations. This prohibition applies to incumbent and non-incumbent constitutional office candidates, but does not apply to judicial and special election candidates.
March 31	Last day of transactions included in the First Report of Receipts and Expenditures.
April 14	First Report of Receipts and Expenditures due. Period covered: 1/1 through 3/31/2014.
April 15	\$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the First Report of Receipts and Expenditures.
May 19	Publication of estimates of election year 2014 public subsidy amounts available for constitutional candidates.
May 20	Candidate filing period opens to run for office. Constitutional candidates must file a Statement of Economic Interest within 14 days after filing for office. Judicial candidates must file a Statement of Economic Interest within 60 days of taking the oath of office.
May 31	Last day of transactions included in the Second Report of Receipts and Expenditures.
June 3	Last day for candidates to file to run for office.
June 16	Second Report of Receipts and Expenditures due. Period covered: 1/1 through 5/31/2014.
June 17	\$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the Second Report of Receipts and Expenditures.
June 17	Notification to constitutional candidates of the minimum amount of public subsidy they may expect to receive.
July 15	60 th day after the legislature adjourned. Constituent services by constitutional candidates (incumbents only) after this date are reported as 100% campaign expenditures.
July 21	Last day for constitutional candidates to raise contributions to qualify for public subsidy.
July 21	Last day of transactions included in the Third Report of Receipts and Expenditures.
July 22	Last day for constitutional candidates to sign and file a Public Subsidy Agreement.

July 22 through August 11	24 Hour Reporting of Large Contributions – Pre-Primary Election Contributions or loans from any one source totaling more than 50 percent of the election segment limit for Constitutional office candidates, and more than \$2,000 for appellate court and supreme court candidates, must be reported to the Board in person by the end of the next business day after receipt or by electronic means within 24 hours after receipt and also on subsequent Reports of Receipts and Expenditures for the year. Failure to file the notice on time will result in a \$50 per day late filing fee. Note: Candidates who are unopposed at the primary election do not need to report large contributions during this period.
July 28	Last day to file an Affidavit of Contributions to qualify for public subsidy.
July 28	Third Report of Receipts and Expenditures due. Period covered: 1/1 through 7/21/2014.
July 29	\$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the Third Report of Receipts and Expenditures.
August 12	PRIMARY ELECTION
August 26	Public subsidy payment distributed to eligible candidates not later than one week after the canvassing board certification of the primary election.
September 16	Last day of transactions included in the Fourth Report of Receipts and Expenditures.
September 23	Fourth Report of Receipts and Expenditures due. Period covered: 1/1 through 9/16/2014.
September 24	\$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the Fourth Report of Receipts and Expenditures.
October 20	Last day of transactions included in the Fifth Report of Receipts and Expenditures.
October 21 through November 3	24 Hour Reporting of Large Contributions – Pre-General Election Contributions or loans from any one source totaling more than 50 percent of the election segment limit for Constitutional office candidates, and more than \$2,000 for appellate court and supreme court candidates, must be reported to the Board in person by the end of the next business day after receipt or by electronic means within 24 hours after receipt and also on subsequent Reports of Receipts and Expenditures for the year. Failure to file the notice on time will result in a \$50 per day late filing fee. Note: Candidates who lost the primary election do not need to report large contributions during this period.
October 27	Fifth Report of Receipts and Expenditures due. Period covered: 1/1 through 10/20/2014. Note: Candidates who lost the primary election do not need to file this report.
October 28	\$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the Fifth Report of Receipts and Expenditures.
November 4	GENERAL ELECTION
December 31	Public Subsidy agreements expire.
